FAIRHOPE BRIDGES

Fairhope Bridges is a technology-based system to connect local donors with families in need of clothes, food or household goods. Fairhope Bridges will enable Fairhope school counselors and social workers to submit needs of students and families to the website, where they will then be shared via email and social media alerts to people who are interested in filling those needs. The program will go beyond food to necessary items like clothes, shoes, mattresses, infant car seats, furniture and more for families that are low-income or have a sudden need, such as after a house fire or medical emergency. Once a community member confirms they will fulfill a particular need, items can be dropped off at The Nix Center and will then be taken to the families. Fairhope Bridges takes away many of the uncertainties of online giving. Donors will know they are giving to vetted, trustworthy people and that their gifts will reach the intended recipient.
