CAREER COACH



Don't forget that we have a career coach! Her name is Mrs. Isbell and she meets with students every week on Tuesdays. NEIGHBORHOOD BRIDGES

Neighborhood Bridges is a technology-based system to connect local donors with families in need of clothes, food or household goods. Neighborhood Bridges will enable Fairhope school counselors and social workers to submit needs of students and families to the website, where they will then be shared via email and social media alerts to people who are interested in filling those needs. The program will go beyond food to necessary items like clothes, shoes, mattresses, infant car seats, furniture and more for families that are low-income or have a sudden need, such as after a house fire or medical emergency. Once a community member confirms they will fulfill a particular need, items can be dropped off at the school that requested it. THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA'S RURAL HEALTH SCHOLAR'S PROGRAM:

This is a 5-week summer program for rising high school seniors from rural counties in Alabama. This program gives students a chance to experience college life, actually live on campus, take two college courses (for college credit), participate in seminars and field trips, shadow physicians at University Medical Center, and receive information about health careers. SAMFORD PHARMACY CAMP
