<u>ACT:</u>

For those of you testing on <u>October 28th</u>, good luck! The next date after this one is <u>December 9th</u>, and that registration deadline is November 3rd for no late fees. Register as soon as you can <u>www.act.org</u>. All of these dates and deadlines can be found on their website!

As you register: Our high school code is <u>011-060</u> and be sure that you include Fairhope High School on your list of who receives your results so we can see them. Also, go ahead and <u>select FOUR colleges</u> when selecting who will be receiving your report. If you wait until your senior year to send it to colleges that you apply to, it costs around \$18 each time you send a score report to a college. It won't hurt to go ahead and select a few colleges you are interested in while it's free to send! About that fee: If you receive free/reduced lunch, you qualify for <u>four</u> fee waivers to take the ACT and SAT during junior and senior years of high school. Come by the counseling office if you have questions about qualifying.

Free Junior ACT: Keep in mind, all juniors now have the opportunity to take the ACT (this is the plus writing version), free of charge, on our campus in the spring. You are automatically registered for this date. The date for the on-campus ACT is **March 12-15, 2024.** Don't plan any trips or college visits on those dates in **MARCH**!

ACT 30+ CLUB

If you have taken the ACT and got a composite score of 30 or above, you are eligible to be a part of the FHS ACT 30+ Club! Just send your score report to me and I will get you added to our list to be recognized! We will recognize all members each quarter with a breakfast!

<u>ASVAB</u>

ASVAB results are in and you should have received them from Mrs. Ainsworth! The military folks will be here to explain them soon and I will let you know that date as soon as I know. Reservations for official college visits must be made through the admissions office of the college you are planning to visit. Your parent must request for you to be excused for the visit at least 2 weeks prior to the visit by emailing a request to our attendance secretary, Mrs. Petrie at spetrie@bcbe.org. Be sure to bring back paperwork/documentation of your visit and turn it in to her upon your return!
